Especially an entrepreneur couple of Stoorstålka Sami Design company, Lotta and her husband told interesting stories of their company and about their philosophy of running it. I especially appreciated their way of thinking about possible challenges. If there is something they do not know how to do, are not happy the way they do or notice their way is too slow, they will create a way to do it better and faster. This quite often requires learning of many new things and skills, but it seemed not to be a problem for them. They are doing business with digitalization focus and that is always interesting as it is important today.









At the Tree Hotel, Britta told us their whole story. Tree Hotel is a good example how you can grow your business far away from cities when you just trust in your ideas, are ready to work hard and have a bit of luck (eg. meet the right people in the press meeting). Tree Hotel owners are a good example when taking things practically further, takes business further.











The story of c/o Gerd was also interesting. Anna-Lena, the cofounder told us the inspiring story of their growth which is based on quality products, hard work, lots of travel and good networking. The story was a good example how it is possible to grow your business also based at a small village and inspire people internationally.





Eva`s and Helena`s storytelling with photos at one dinner was interesting too. They served us local tapas while telling interesting stories of their life and surroundings in different seasons. I think this was a result of a good product development process which would work great in Finland too.
